

The House Rules of the International Semmelweis Carnival

1. The personal scope of this Policy of Participation applies to all participants, most especially
 - a. To participants in possession of an invitation to the International Semmelweis Carnival;
 - b. To those involved with the organization and conducting of the International Semmelweis Carnival;
 - c. To the service providers involved with the organization and conducting of the International Semmelweis Carnival (e.g. security personnel, cafeteria workers, performers, etc.) and those in contractual employment with or employed in another form of legal working relationship;
 - d. To other visitors of the International Semmelweis Carnival.
2. The following policy's aerial scope applies to the entirety of the International Semmelweis Carnival. Entering and attending the event is only possible when complying with these rules. Those located at the venue that are not participants or are without prior registration will be immediately removed by the organizers.
3. The invitation to the event venue is only valid for one entry.
4. The organizers have set up these rules in order to insure the civilized entertainment and networking of all participants, however, under extraordinary circumstances, they may limit or stop all activities – illegal activities in particular – which endanger the lives, health and physical wellbeing of others.
5. It is forbidden to take any tool, material into the venue that may be used to damage lives, cause bodily harm, or materially damage the property of the event and its participants. This applies especially to the following: pointed and sharp objects, and objects with a similar risk of jab or cut injuries; weapons or items that may be considered weapons; explosive or flammable materials (e.g. pyrotechnic articles), poison, drugs, etc. The organizers have the right to confiscate these items, or refuse entry carrying them. The security personnel are authorized to deny entry to those carrying forbidden items or to deny permission to take these items onto the premises. The security personnel are also authorized to remove certain persons or prevent entry.
6. The organizers comply with personal and private security service set out by the 2005 CXXXIII. Before entry, and throughout the venue the organizers and the security personnel have the right to check the clothing and bags of guests according to paragraph 26 of the 2005 CXXXIII.
7. The organizers provide the security and insurance of the event. Organizers may bring personal belongings, clothing, etc. to the event venue as their personal responsibility. Each will be responsible for the protection of their own belongings. The organizers kindly ask the participants not to bring highly valuable items (jewelry, technical articles, etc.) or a great sum of cash to the event.
8. Bringing alcoholic beverages to the Event is strictly prohibited
9. A person may be removed from the event venue if they endanger the lives, physical wellbeing or private rights of others, their natural environment; or are truculent, or give any cause for police intervention up, incites hatred against any group of society, or, with their aggressive behavior disrupt the peace within the audience; refuses to let relinquish forbidden items on the venue despite having been told to act as such; if they used an unofficial entrance to the venue or have previously been removed from it; are under the legal age limit; or had previously been denied entry to the venue by the event's organizers. The price of the invitation will not be refunded to those who have been removed from the venue for any of the above-mentioned reasons.
10. At the event, no flammable, dangerous acts may be performed at the event, or any that may endanger the health of attendees.

11. Should the events be canceled for reasons not within the control of the organizers, Force majeure, they are not obligated to refund the price of admission or be any form of compensation, and they will not be forced to make any other form of payment under any legal premise. This also applies, but not exclusively, to a potential evacuation ordered by the authorities, to extraordinary environmental circumstances that may endanger lives, physical well-being or private rights; a bomb drill; or a crime committed by a third party that endangers lives, physical well-being or private rights of attendees.
12. At the event, all equipment, tools, dance floors, etc. may be used by all, at one's own risk. Areas and their tools that have been closed off from the attendees, may only be used by persons permitted to do so, with the means to provide proof of authorisation. Damages that occur because of improper use of objects will be reimbursed by the user. The organizers are free from any liability for personal injuries, accidents, damages that occur as a result of the use of tools and previously installed games.
13. Anyone who damages the property, inventory or tools of others or the events must reimburse the other party.
14. The organizers accept no responsibility for potential personal injuries or private valuables.
15. Attendees must immediately inform the responsible organizer at the event of potential accidents, injuries and extraordinary occurrences.
16. Everyone participates of their own free will at the International Semmelweis Carnival; neither its entirety, nor parts of it are obligatory. If any of the events organized programmes conflict with the participants' principles and moral standards, they are not obligated to participate in it. The program does not contain any tasks or activities that entail references to sexuality. Participation cannot be considered voluntary if coerced by peer pressure.
17. Minors (people under the age of 18) must not be served alcohol. People may be asked to present legal documents verifying their age when being served at the bar.
18. The programmes, the Participants' behavior and communication must be in line with the Values only University and the contents of the ethical code, the drug prevention and communicational bylaws (available at www.semmelweis.hu) and the relating operative laws of Hungary (available at www.njt.hu).
19. Organizers reserve the right to change the programme.
20. At the location of the International Semmelweis Carnival, participants may approach organizers with their complaints and suggestions, personally at the International Semmelweis Carnival, on the phone or via email at vezetoseg@iocs.hu. They can also turn to the University's Rectorial Secretariat (rektor@semmelweis-univ.hu, Üllői út 26, 1085 Budapest, 101, 1st floor, 06 1 317 2400) anonymously as well. Every complaint will be investigated by the University, with the involvement of the authorities, if necessary. The identity of those who make these complaints will be treated confidentially by the IÖCS and the University and will not be handed over to a third party.
21. Participants hereby take notice that failure to keep the rules set out by this Policy, reasonable suspicion of criminal behavior or offenses will authorize the security personnel to retain the offender until necessary legal conclusions are drawn. In the event of a crime, the perpetrator may be apprehended by anyone, who will have the obligation to call the police (127th paragraph of XIX, 1998). Participants explicitly agree hereby that this action when performed against them does not constitute as a limitation or violation of the right for freedom or movement.

22. Any action that violates the norm or can be considered a legal offense within the student's legal relationship (within 5 months of having committed the act), will be followed by disciplinary action by the University at the International Semmelweis Carnival. The disciplinary punishment may be:
 - a. Reprehension
 - b. Strict reprehension
 - c. Limitation or complete stay from paying the amount set out by the allowance and allocational set of rules for the maximum of 6 months
 - d. Interdict from one's studies for the maximum of 2 semesters
 - e. Expulsion from the University
23. If the security personnel is suspected of possession or consumption of narcotics, or of another crime, they may be searched along with their belongings. At this procedure, the involved, the responsible personnel, as well as **Zsófia Sebeszta** (president) must be present.
24. At the International Semmelweis Carnival, other private or public events can only be advertised when permitted by the organizers, and only for organizations whose funds will be used for the betterment of the community.
25. During the event, taking photographs, making recordings, videos, and storing or posting these to any platform (e.g. Facebook, Flickr, Instagram, Tumblr, Twitter, YouTube, etc.) is forbidden if it violates someone's person, rights, or legal interest. Retaining these recordings or posting them is also forbidden after the event! The organizers reserve the right to have them deleted from public platforms by their maker and/or uploader.
26. Upon entry and/or receiving the invitation to the ball, the participant accepts that they may be photographed or recorded at the event. These recordings will be stored by the organizers, and may be used for their operation, handed over to the university. They, however, must not request payment of any sort for these recordings.
27. If the participants have knowledge of a recording that is offensive to them or others, they must immediately report it to the organizers so that they can investigate and delete it if necessary.
28. The NAIH does not register the management of these pieces of information in accordance with the 65th paragraph (3) a) of the CXII. (Info-law), 2011.
29. The aforementioned applies to all participants equally.
30. Upon entry and/or receiving the invitation to the carnival, participants agree to and accept the Policy of the International Semmelweis Carnival, have acquainted themselves and consider them mandatory for themselves. They also hereby proclaim to be participating in their responsibility. They understand that the breaking of these limitations will have them removed from the actual programme, or in the case of repeated or severe offenses, from the whole area of the event, in which case they will also face disciplinary action and legal action in case they break the penal code or commit an offense. They are fully aware that disciplinary action can entail having their studies be discontinued or even expulsion from the university.
31. We take special care to secure the physical well-being, health, dignity, autonomy of participants. In view of this, the University's Rector has pre-approved the programme plan of the International Semmelweis Carnival. However, IÖCS will be responsible for their implementation, for all communication pertaining to the Ball and at the Ball, and for upholding the ethical norms of the University.
